James Carpenter ha studiato architettura e scultura presso la Rhode Island School of Design, laureandosi nel 1972.

Ha esposto le sue sculture ed progetti di film-installazioni negli Stati Uniti e in Europa, e ha lavorato dal 1972 al 1982 come consulente presso la Corning Glass Works a Corning, New York. È il primo scoprire e progettare applicazioni architettoniche di vetro. Lavorò infatti allo sviluppo di nuovi materiali di vetro.

Mr Carpenter ha ricevuto numerosi premi tra i quali il "National Environmental Design Award" da parte della Smithsonian Institution, l'"American Institute of Architects Honor Award" ed il "MacArthur Foundation Fellowship" nel 2004.

Collabora con Venini nei primi anni Settanta.

James Carpenter studied architecture and sculpture at the Rhode Island School of Design, graduating in 1972.

Mr Carpenter actively exhibited his sculpture and installation film projects in the United States and Europe and worked from 1972 through 1982 as a consultant with Corning Glass Works in Corning, New York. He is a pioneer in discovering and designing architectural applications for glass. He worked on the development of new glass materials.

Mr Carpenter received numerous awards including the National Environmental Design Award from the Smithsonian Institution, the American Institute of Architects Honor Award and a MacArthur Foundation Fellowship in 2004.
